CHILDREN'S PARTICIPATION IN SCHOOLS AND THE LOCAL COMMUNITY

Call for submission of information about projects

The programme "Focus on Children and Families" is one of a series of activities and projects within Directorate General III for Social Cohesion of the Council of Europe to promote social cohesion and tackle policy issues affecting children and families. The programme is co-ordinated by the Forum for Children and Families, which has decided to studying children's participation in decision making in families and other living arrangements, schools and community, taking as a starting point article 12 of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child.

Knowing that this is an area in which much interesting work is already going on, we would like to create an inventory of good practice with policy recommendations on **children's participation in schools and the local community**, by identifying projects conducted in the 44 member states of the Council of Europe in these areas. We also plan to visit and study selected projects.

All providers of information will receive a copy of the catalogue of projects submitted!

Governments, experts, NGO's and other relevant associations in the member states are therefore kindly requested to submit information about projects dealing with children's participation in schools and the local community as described below.

For the purpose of this request, the term "participation" should be interpreted as "children expressing their views and these views being given weight in the decision making process".

By "projects" we mean any pilot projects, model activity or programme which is either completed (within the last 10 years) or currently running. Initiatives that are only in their planning stage will not be considered.

Children's participation in schools

You are invited to send information about projects which aim at involving children (boys and/or girls) aged 5 - 11 in decision making at schools. The projects should show how children's rights are taken seriously and how children at this age are given the opportunity to participate in planning and decision-making concerning the formal learning process (e.g. curriculum, evaluation, working methods, timetable, etc.), as well as with regard to other matters related to the school (e.g. seating in the classroom, equipment, building, playground, etc).

Children's participation in the local community

You are also invited to send information about projects which aim at involving children (boys and/or girls) aged 5 - 11 in decision making in the local community (implemented by local governments, schools, NGO's, churches, children themselves, etc.) The projects should show how children's rights are taken seriously and how children at this age are given the opportunity to participate in planning and decision-making concerning their immediate environment and the daily life activities in their local community.
